Consolidated Post Reports

It's that time of the year. We will be receiving our forms shortly from Department.

Here is what I send to all the members in Post 24 every year to ask for their input for our Consolidated Post Report. Feel free to use it with your membership.

We are getting close to Consolidated Report time. The Consolidated Post Report (CPR) was established in 1975 in order to assist Departments in the documentation of the various activities a specific post has done during the twelve-month reporting period June 1, through May 31. The Consolidated Post Report may be the most important document our post will complete this year.

Our Post's information, combined with that of other posts, is used when the National Commander and others testify on Capitol Hill on behalf of all veterans. Each post has a story to tell, and when we speak collectively our strength is magnified. Now IS THE TIME TO TOOT YOUR OWN HORN AND LET US KNOW WHAT YOU HAVE DONE. So please start adding up all your community service hours that you have accumulated over the year since last June.

Examples are volunteering for school programs such coaching, as participating in a "Vet's in the Classroom" program, programs on flag etiquette; volunteer hours spent on Boy Scouts or Girl Scout programs; if you did any pro bono work; volunteer hours spent as a firefighter, paramedic, personnel, volunteer rescue policeman, etc.; volunteer hours spent at the post for fundraising activities; volunteer service at a local hospital (to include driving patients to and from their medical appointments); have you helped a neighbor around their house with yard work or repairs; have you given blood (let us know how many times and how much blood you donated); have you given any monetary contributions local to charities, how about donations to Toys for Tots? If you have any doubts as to what you may report, ask yourself this question: "Does the program that you spent time and/or money on pertain to the good of the community, state, or nation?

Submit what you did, who you did it for, how many hours, how many miles you traveled to do it, and, if your donated money – how much and for what cause. Please e-mail your information to me at ______ and let us know how you served. Everyone has done something for his or her community so now is the time to let us know.
