Legislation (Bill Aramony)

CAMP LEJEUNE AND OTHER VETERAN CLAIMS. Watch for bad actors and exercise due diligence before agreeing to representation for your veteran's claim. The Department of Justice warns against being overcharged for Camp Lejeune administrative claims or litigation https://www.justice.gov/civil/camplejeune-justice-act-claims If you have the Camp Lejeune claim, let The American Legion help you through your claims officer or through the Legion law firm. See—

www.camplejeunelitigationteam.com/al/ – for an online form for Legionnaires and their family members. The law firm also has a 24-hour phone number – 800-898-9450.

LAW FIRM. And other VA accredited law firms exist. If you prefer legal representation, honest attorneys do exist (Gasp!). Do your homework before hiring them, and make sure that the fee is reasonable. The Department of Justice position is that any fee should be 20% or less for administrative claims and 25% or less for court litigation. Or use Virginia Department of Veteran Services or the American Legion service representatives for free.

YOUR CONTRIBUTIONS. Please let your post commander know what you do for Americanism and your volunteer work. If you are helping your neighbors or are active in the community, you are more than a vote. You're another example of veterans making the community better. Your delegates, senators and federal representatives need to know.

Also on April 9, thirteen residents of Greenspring Village attended Veterans Having Coffee, a coffee klatch open to all resident veterans of Greenspring Village that Post 123 sponsors monthly.
