	This dates back to 1939, the National Legionnaire (a newspaper that ran more or less monthly from January 1935 through November 1948) announced that April had become designated as American Legion Child Welfare Month and called upon posts to report their activities throughout the nation.
	Fast forward two yearsto 1941, a national resolution formally designating April as Child Welfare Month.

	2. "The VIRGINIA-class submarine USS IOWA (SSN-797) will be commissioned in Groton CT this coming Saturday at 8:45 (central standard time).	
	IOWA the names of warships are always spelled out in capital letters) is an "attack submarine" armed with torpedoes, anti-ship missiles, and land attack missiles. This will be the fifth USS IOWA to serve in our Navy.	
	Historically: The previous USS IOWA (BB-61) was the lead ship of a class of four battleships — the last such ships ever built. These ships served in WWII, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War. They were brought out of retirement for active service from 1982-1990 as part of the "600-ship Navy" built to counter the Soviet. During this period of service, they were fitted with anti-ship and land attack cruise missiles.
